Grammar corner

Countable – Uncountable Nouns

- **Countable** nouns are those that can be counted (*one egg, two eggs, etc.*).
- **Uncountable** nouns are those that cannot be counted (*milk, sugar, etc.*).
Uncountable nouns take a singular verb and are not used with *a/an*.

Groups of uncountable nouns include:

- mass nouns (*water, bread, wine, etc.*).
- sports (*football, basketball, etc.*).
- natural phenomena (*rain, snow, etc.*).
- collective nouns (*money, furniture, luggage, etc.*).
- certain other nouns (*accommodation, luck, etc.*).

We use **some** in the affirmative with uncountable and countable nouns in the plural and in requests. 1, 4

We use **any** in the negative and interrogative. 2, 3

We use **a few** with countable nouns. 5

We use **a little** with uncountable nouns. 6

A lot of/Lots of – Much – Many

- **A lot of/Lots of** are used with both plural countable and uncountable nouns. They are normally used in affirmative sentences. The **of** is omitted when a **lot/lots** is not followed by a noun. *There are a lot/lots of apples in the fridge. I can make an apple pie. "Have we got any oranges?" "Yes, we've got lots."*
- **Much** and **many** are usually used in negative or interrogative sentences. **Much** is used with uncountable nouns and **many** is used with plural countable nouns. *There aren't many strawberries left. We haven't got much coffee.*
- **How much** and **how many** are used in questions and negations.
How much + uncountable noun → amount
How many + countable noun → number
How much sugar do you take?
How many biscuits do you want?
